

STATEMENT OF COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS
March 10th, 2026

The Ogden City Council met in Regular Session on Tuesday, March 10th, 2026, at 6:00 p.m. Mayor Margaret Liston presided. Members present were Councilman Aaron Crane, Councilman David Ohlson, Councilman Brian Reimers and Councilwoman Lori Anderson. City staff present were City Administrator Emily Clausen and City Clerk Allison Frazier. Additional attendees present were 6 guests.

Anderson made a motion, Crane seconded to approve the agenda.
Ayes: All Present, Motion Carried.

Department reports were presented. Chief Bailey reported 65 total calls for service and that he spent about 36 hours and 13 minutes between the schools for the month of February. He would like to note that during the snowstorm on February 19th and 20th there were 43 calls involving accidents or vehicles going off the road in Boone County and only 1 of those calls was in Ogden for a minor property damage collision. He credits our city crew's hard work on cleaning the streets and citizens' safe driving.

Dennis Good was sworn in as the newly elected councilmember by City Clerk Allison Frazier.

Councilmember comments: Councilman Crane is concerned with the rising costs of infrastructure and would like to look into cost share for future growth. Ohlson would like to see the storm drains cleaned out. City Administrator will speak with Chad Thede about getting that done. Councilman Reimers and City Administrator Emily Clausen met with Jess Guess about the Future of Fun Days. She was open to helping Shannon this year. Councilwoman Lori Anderson attended the Legacy meeting. There's been a change in leadership President is Derek Kennedy, Vice President is Leslie Heineman, Treasurer is Andy Hunziker and Secretary is Lisa Hockemeier. Annual meeting for Legacy is March 25th at 5:30 pm. There's been some progress on the "Howe" park project. Lights are coming in about half the price of the original quote thanks to Brandon Craighton and OMU. Mark Trueblood talked to Martin Marietta about discounted road stone and that will save about \$11,000. Stacey Knight is also willing to help with the project. Councilman Denny Good is thankful for the warm welcome and ready to get up to speed on projects.

Public comments: Jason Weber wanted the city to know that Black Hills will be offering funds for Fire Departments. He said the information is on the Black Hills website. Mark Trueblood wanted to welcome Denny to the Council.
